The IU is required to comply with approximately 46 professional standards in order to receive accredited status.

The CFA assessment team will consist of Juli Brown, Accreditation Manager, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and Sean Shrader, Accreditation Manager, Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. The assessors will review written materials, interview individuals, and visit offices and other places where compliance can be witnessed.

Once the assessors complete their review of the Agency, they report back to the CFA, which will then decide if the Agency is eligible to receive accredited status. If initial accreditation is achieved, the OIG IU's accreditation will be valid for 3 years.
