January Monthly Actions: Agency Took Licensure Action against Nine Providers, Four Additional Providers Terminated from the Medicaid Program

Tallahassee, Fla.—The Agency for Health Care Administration (Agency) issued final orders to nine providers for failure to meet licensure requirements during the month of January. The Agency issued four final orders to deny a license renewal application, four to revoke an existing license and one that resulted in the provider surrendering the license. Some of these providers were enrolled in the Medicaid program; however, the Agency has terminated or is in the process of terminating their participation in the program.

“We remain diligent in our efforts to address providers who don’t follow the rules,” said Secretary Liz Dudek. “The Agency continues to offer providers with the necessary training and education to help them keep their doors open. We want providers to be successful, but we won’t compromise the health and safety of Floridians.”

Four additional providers were issued a final order terminating them from participation in the Medicaid program in January. These terminations resulted from sanctions imposed for failing to furnish records within the timeframes established by the Agency, pleading guilty of conspiracy to commit health care fraud, being convicted for intentionally acting outside the course of professional practice by distributing controlled substances, and for failing to reimburse the Agency. These providers also have been reported to the federal government for placement on the federal exclusion list, which prohibits them from participating in Medicaid and Medicare nationwide.
