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ACCREDITATION TEAM INVITES PUBLIC COMMENTS ABOUT THE AGENCY FOR HEALTH CARE ADMINISTRATION OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL

Tallahassee, FLA - The Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA)'s Office of Inspector General (OIG) is undergoing assessment to retain reaccreditation by Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA). A team of assessors for CFA will arrive November 17, 2022, to examine all aspects the OIG's Investigation Unit (IU)'s policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services. AHCA OIG has to comply with approximately 48 standards in order to receive accredited status, seven are not applicable. The assessment team is composed of trained assessors who work at similar agencies throughout the state.

As part of the assessment, agency members and the general public are invited to offer comments to the assessment team. A copy of the standards manual is available on the CFA website at www.flaccreditation.org under the standards tab.

Once the CFA assessors complete their review of the agency, they report back to the full Commission, which will then make a determination on granting reaccreditation status. If approved, the reaccreditation will be for a three-year period.
